HOW TO LODGE AN ENTRY IN CLASSES IN THIS SCHEDULE:

- **ON-LINE WITH SHOWDAY ONLINE, or**
- **by manually completing the Entry Form and mailing or delivering to the Show Office by the published closing date.**

Entries to all Sections in this Schedule can be made ONLINE in 2022.

ONLINE ENTRY INSTRUCTIONS:

STEP 1 – CREATE YOUR ACCOUNT

1. Go to <https://showday.online/>
2. If you have not previously registered, i.e. a first-time user, click 'REGISTER' at the top of the screen and this will take you to a new screen.
3. Click 'Create new account' and input your details to use the system.
4. This is a 2-step process. After registering on Showday Online, you will receive a confirmation email which you must action to finalise your account.
5. If you are already registered on SHOWDAY click 'LOG IN' and input the requested details.

STEP 2 – ENTER CLASSES -

Once logged in as detailed above.

1. Select Hawkesbury District Agricultural Association Show (light blue font) from the list 'Open for Entries' on the right-hand side of page. This will take you to the Hawkesbury Show Schedule details.
2. Enter the Name of the Exhibitor/Competitor and Exhibit Name (optional).
3. Scroll across to 'Select Classes' and select the Section you wish to enter
4. Review the details box and click OK at the bottom right of box.
5. Select the 'Subsection' tab, then Select 'Classes' tab. This will then display all Classes that are available to be entered. Tick classes that you want to enter and click 'ADD ENTRY' and complete any additions details required. If you wish to put more than 1 entry into a Class then you have to 're-enter' the Name of the Exhibitor/Competitor and then scroll down to 'Number of Entries' and update the input box with the number of entries, select the Classes tab again, tick the appropriate Class and click 'ADD ENTRY'.
6. If you wish to enter further classes in the name of another competitor, repeat steps 2 - 5.
7. Proceed to instructions in 10.
8. If you wish to enter bulk entries, scroll to the bottom of the page and select "ADD BULK ENTRIES"
9. (i) if submitting 1 exhibit in a Class and would like to list all the contributors (e.g. names of all the class students) then enter the names of the contributors in the box 'Name of the Exhibitor/Competitor' by inserting the School name then each student's name, followed by a space, then the next name, all on the same line. This could be completed by 'Paste' from a Word document, then select the Class to enter, then select "ADD ENTRY". Repeat step for a further entry, e.g. class students wishing to enter another Class. Select "ADD ENTRY" after each.
(ii) if submitting separate entries for individuals in the same class then insert in the 'Name of Exhibitor/Competitor' the individual names of each entrant on a separate line then tick the Class to be entered and then 'ADD ENTRY'.
10. Scroll further down page and review details in "YOUR CLASSES' to ensure all entries are listed.
11. Submit your Entry Form by selecting '**CONTINUE**'.

You will be directed to a Payment Gateway to pay for your entries by 'Mastercard' or 'Visa'.

Entries will not be accepted without confirmed payment.

RECIPE - The following recipe is compulsory for all entrants.

Ingredients

250g (8ozs) sultana
250g chopped raisins
250g currants
125g (4ozs) shopped mixed peel
90g (3ozs) chopped red glace cherries
90g chopped blanched almonds
1/3 cup sherry or brandy
250g plain flour
60g (2ozs) self-raising flour
¼ tspn grated nutmeg
½ tspn ground ginger
½ tspn ground cloves
250g (8oz) butter
250g (8oz) soft brown sugar
½ tspn lemon essence OR
½ tspn grated lemon rind

½ tspn almond essence
½ tspn vanilla essence
4 large eggs

Method

Mix together all the fruits and nuts and sprinkle with the sherry or brandy. Cover and leave for at least 1 hour, but preferably overnight.

Sift together the flours and spices. Cream together the butter and sugar with the essences.

Add the eggs one at a time, beating well after each addition, then alternatively add the fruits and flour mixtures. Mix thoroughly. The mixture should be stiff enough to support a wooden spoon.

Place the mixture into a prepared tin, square 20cm x 20cm (8" x 8") and bake in a slow oven for approximately 3 ½ - 4 hours. Allow the cake to cool in the tin.

Note: To ensure uniformity and depending on the size, it is suggested the raisins be snipped into 2-3 pieces, cherries into 4-6 pieces and almonds crosswise into 3-4 pieces. The height of the cake should not exceed 5.7cm (57mm)

Ingredients

250g butter
1kg dried fruit
250g chopped dates
250g brown sugar
125ml (1/2 cup) water
125ml (1/2 cup) orange juice
Finely grated zest of ½ lemon
Finely grated zest of ½ orange
1 tablespoon golden syrup
½ tsp bicarbonate of soda
250g (1 2/3 cups) plain flour
50g (1/3 cup) self-raising flour
Pinch of salt
5 eggs, lightly beaten

Method

Put the butter, mixed fruit, dates, sugar, water and orange juice into a large saucepan and bring to the
boil over a low heat, stirring occasionally until the
Sugar is dissolved
Remove the saucepan from the heat and stir in the
lemon and orange zest, golden syrup and

 - c) **Three Different Types:** the 3 items in an entry must differ from each other in terms of their construction technique and/or their purpose eg.1 a knitted jumper, blanket and tea cosy OR eg.2 a knitted tea cosy, a crocheted tea cosy or a felted tea cosy OR eg.3 a knitted jumper, a knitted blanket and a crocheted blanket.
2. The **whole** article and/or garment must be constructed of, and contain a minimum of, **80% wool**.
3. Exhibits (articles/garments) may be knitted, crocheted, sewn, felted etc and must be hand crafted (use of sewing machine is permitted).
4. **A sample of the yarn, fabric or fibre with label must be attached to each item making up the exhibit.** If a label is not available as a hand spun/felted, a handwritten label with relevant details and sample will suffice.
5. An exhibit in this competition may consist of the work of one individual or a group of individuals, or an organization.
6. All three articles/garments must have been completed within the 12 months prior to the local show and made by the exhibitor/s.
7. An exhibit having won at a local show may be exhibited (the same three articles/garments) at the Group Final. The winning exhibit at the Group Final is then eligible to compete in the State Final.
8. An exhibit is only eligible to represent one Show Society at Group level and one Group at State level.
9. An exhibit (article/garment) that has previously competed at Group level is not eligible to compete again.
10. If this class is not scheduled or attracts no entries at a local show, the Chief Pavilion Steward in consultation with the appropriate Pavilion Section Judges, may select three suitable individual exhibits and, with the exhibitors' permission, enter them in the Group judging as an exhibit representing the particular Show Society concerned.
11. It is the responsibility of the Group Secretary and winner to co-ordinate the transfer of the winning entry to the ASC Office in Sydney for the State judging.
12. Recommendation: State Final garments are to include a photo of the garment being worn (where possible and applicable).
