- Exhibits must have been finished within the past 12 months and must never have been worn or used.
- NOVICE has less than 2 yrs. experience.
- Junior – under 18 years of age - may enter any class in Spinning & Weaving. Age will be taken from the 1st day of the Show. Date of Birth must be stated on entry form.
- **PLEASE NOTE** – samples of Fibre or yarn and short description for **all** Handspun and Handwoven classes must be supplied.
- All hanks in spinning classes must be 50gms or over (unless otherwise specified) and washed.
- All classes in handspun (yarn & garments) must be entirely your own work.

SPINNING

Class 16400 Skein of fine handspun sheep fleece, 2ply equivalent, suitable for lace knitting, hand prepared, plied. Not less than 25gms. State purpose.

Class 16401 Skein of fine handspun sheep fleece, 4 ply equivalent, hand prepared, plied. Not less than 50gms. State purpose.

Class 16402 Skein of handspun sheep fleece, 8 ply equivalents, hand prepared and plied. State purpose.
1st prize - **\$25 donated by Springwood Spinners.**

Class 16403 Skein of handspun naturally coloured (no white) wool, hand prepared and plied. State purpose.

Class 16404 Skein of bulky handspun sheep fleece, hand prepared and plied. State purpose.

Class 16405 Skein of handspun naturally coloured (no white) wool, hand prepared, plied and overdyed. Must include a sample of the original sheep's fleece. State purpose.

Class 16406 Skein of fine yarn from commercially prepared fibres, plied. Not less than 50gms. State purpose.

Class 16407 Skein of 8ply equivalent or thicker from commercially prepared fibre. Not less than 100gms. State purpose.

Class 16408 Skein of yarn spun entirely on a drop or support spindle. Lace weight Not less than 25gms

Class 16409 Skein of fibre blend, hand carded, handspun, plied. Include samples of all elements used. State if full or partial blend. State purpose.

Class 16410 Skein of any other handspun fibre (not sheep's wool or alpaca), plied. State composition & purpose.

Class 16411 Skein of handspun alpaca, hand prepared, plied. State purpose.

1st prize **Fleece donated by Australia Alpaca Association Hawkesbury Region**

Class 16412 Skein of handspun novelty / art yarn plied. May be dyed. Not less than 100gms. State purpose.

Class 16420 Novice Hand Knitted or Crochet Garment/Article made from handspun fibre (for those with less than 2 years' experience in spinning).

Class 16421 Article or Garment handmade from Alpaca Fibre, using any technique (must contain 80% alpaca).

ARTICLES IN COMMERCIAL DYEING

Class 16425 Three (3) hanks of different colours or techniques of handspun yarn using commercial dyes. State dyes, techniques/s and purpose.

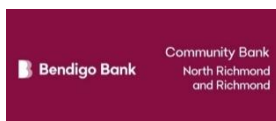

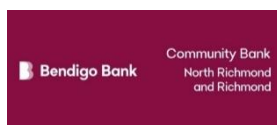
